



INTRODUCTION


Kashmir International Relief Fund (KIRF) is a non-profit and non-governmental charitable organisation registered with Azad Jammu & Kashmir Council Islamabad under registration number 242/2005. After 13th constitutional amendment KIRF has been registered by the Directorate of Social Welfare Govt. of Azad Jammu & Kashmir Muzaffarabad vide Registration No. DSW/NGO/GOVT(PROV)67/2022 dated 05-04-2022. It has been working in Azad Kashmir since 1992 with the objective to uplift the poor and unprivileged segment of the society, especially rural and far-flung areas of the state by providing health, education and skills to the women.

One of the objectives of KIRF is to provide necessary emergency relief to the affected people in case of natural disasters especially in times of floods and earthquakes. In the past KIRF has played a considerable role in assisting thousands of people in dire need of emergency for food, clean water, shelters and medical treatment, particularly after the devastation caused by the earthquake of 8th, October 2005. Similarly, the same services were provided after the destruction caused by the earthquake of 24th, September, 2019. Hundreds of precious lives were saved by providing emergency treatment to the victims in KIRF Community Hospital Jatlan. Despite medical treatment, tents, food items and clean drinking water were provided to the families of victims on an immediate basis. Moreover 88 effected families were financially assisted @ Rs. 50,000/- to each family for their rehabilitation with the corporation of Waltham Forest Islamic Association London and PakTrust London.

KIRF has also assisted 174 families financially @ Rs.5000/- to each family affected by COVID-19 with the co-operation of PakTrust London.

Soon after the floods 2022 in Pakistan KIRF deputed a team of volunteers to support the flood victims in District Rajanpur where they arranged medical campus in different villages, victims were provided medical treatment and meals. The team has also arranged spray to kill mosquitos, the victims were provided Nets and Lotions. Further more 50 Hand Pumps were installed for clean drinking water, 50 families were also provided a shelter of One constructed room to each family.

Presently, besides providing health facilities free of cost to the very needy and poor segment of society in the rural area through KIRF Community Hospital Jatlan, KIRF has also established Kidney Dialysis Centre at Jatlan, patients of renal failure are being provided facility of dialysis free of charges since 10th June 2021.

- To provide educational facilities to the underprivileged children in the far-flung and remote areas of Azad Kashmir.
- To empower women by supporting them in enhancing their skills through vocational training and establishing their own small businesses.
- To provide emergency relief to the effected victims of natural disasters.
- To provide clean water to the residents through launching water supply schemes.







Now premature and weak newborn infants have not to be shifted to other cities, all relevant facilities are available in this department. Moreover two separate wards for renal patients carrier of hepatitis B and C to secure the other patients from infections have been established in the premises of KIRF Kidney Dialysis Centre. Now every type of renal patient is availing facility of kidney dialysis free of charges from the centre. During this year three more haemodialysis machines have been added in the centre. Due to increase in numbers of renal patients second shift has also been started as such there is no renal patient in our waiting list.

All of this has come possible by the financial support of benefactors and other organisations supporting KIRF. I, on behalf of my organisation grateful to all donors and especially trustees of Paktrust London.

We have a future Plan to establish a paramedics training centre so that young boys and girls can get training in this field. It will not only to contribute a share to meet unemployment but also the young generation will have an opportunity to have jobs abroad, moreover the patients will also be cared better.

I'm grateful to my colleagues (members and volunteers of KIRF) staff of KIRF who have cooperated me during the year.

Message from Medical Administrator

The establishment of this hospital was very much needed by the local community as there was no other reasonable health facility from Mangla to Bhimber and DHQH Bhimber was in a primitive state. A huge population in case of emergency, has to go to DHQ Hospital Mirpur, sometimes with catastrophic results. I can say without any exaggeration that this unit is serving its purpose and contributing in relieving the pains of deserving population.

In June 2021, KIRF established kidney dialysis center, a service, very much required by local population.

Alhamdulillah the center is providing 100% free dialysis services. Up till June 2023 we have done 4850 at cost 26m. This was not possible without generous cooperation of local community and our brothers and sisters abroad. I am thankful to Paktrust London, who are working and as a sister organization.

Alhamdulillah, in addition to 24/7 emergency services consultants in the field of Pediatrics, Medicine, Surgery, ENT, Endocrinology, Rheumatology and orthopedics are regularly visiting the hospital and providing services at a very low cost than the town.

It will not be fair if I miss to mention efforts of the governing body and executive committee present and past who are working day and night voluntarily to make this health facility a role model for others.

I am thankful to all medical officers and consultants for their commendable services.



Special appreciation is for Dr. Anila Saqib, gynecologist of this hospital. She is available day and night when her services are required. OT staff and nurses working in Gynae /Obst. unit deserve special appreciation. All nursing and other staff is committed and perform their assignments satisfactorily.

I. HEALTH

KIRF COMMUNITY HOSPITAL JATLAN

In the field of health, KIRF has been operating "KIRF Community Hospital Jatlan" since 2005. The hospital is located on the bank of Canal Upper Jhelum, Jatlan, District Mirpur. Around the radius of 20 kilometers of the hospital there is no such facility. The hospital provides medical facilities to the residents of Jatlan and surrounding areas which includes District Bhimber Azad Kashmir, District Gujrat and District Jhelum of Punjab Pakistan. It is 70 bedded Hospital that provides facilities for Emergency, OPD, Gynae / Obstet., Surgical, General Medicine, Pediatric, X-ray, Laboratory, Ultrasound, ECG, ENT, Orthopedics and First aid to Trauma patients. The hospital provides services around the clock, free of charges to poor people and on subsidized rates to general public. Deserving families have been issued Zakat Fund (ZF) cards to avail medical treatment free of charges.

During the year 2022-23, 47 new ZF cards have been issued to deserving families & **81805** patients have been provided different medical facilities.

KIRF KIDNEY DIALYSIS CENTRE JATLAN

High blood pressure and diabetes are two most common causes of kidney failure. Kidney failure does not happen overnight, it is the outcome of gradually deteriorating kidneys to perform their daily functions.

Kidneys keep the whole body in balance by removing waste products and extra water from the human body. When Kidney failure occurs, it means that Kidneys are damaged, they cannot perform these vital functions appropriately. There is no cure for kidney failure except transplant surgery which is not affordable to many.

The number of patients with chronic renal failure in the state of Azad Jammu and Kashmir is constantly increasing with an estimated annual incidence " every 10th person has some sort of kidney problem worldwide ". The situation in the state is however alarming as around 100 new patients with end stage renal disease are emerging every year especially in District Mirpur. The reason behind this alarming number of kidney patients is lack of health awareness. Situation needs a special study to evaluate the situation.

The treatment of renal failure is very expensive, once it is diagnosed then a patient needs transplantation of kidney or dialysis on a regular basis. Keeping in view the severe need and also dream of the Chairman of KIRF Ch. Rashid Ali, management of Kashmir International Relief Fund has established KIRF Kidney Dialysis Centre Jatlan along with KIRF Community Hospital Jatlan.



Al-Flah trust constructed the building with its own resources and handed over to the management of KIRF, Waltham Forest Islamic Association London donated four new German kidney dialysis units. PakTrust London donated a machine and arranged fund raising for the operational expenses of the centre.

Alhumdolillah KIRF Kidney Dialysis Centre Jatlan is smoothly running with the cooperation of Paktrust London, Waltham Forest Islamic Association London and other philanthropists.

During the year 2022-23 (3056) dialysis session were carried out in the centre.

NEW DEVELOPMENTS

Kidney Dialysis of Hep. B and Hep C Positive Cases

Two separate units have been established to provide dialysis services to the patients declared Hepatitis “B” or Hepatitis “C” positive. Every possible measure has been taken to prevent spread of these infections. Separate qualified staff has been hired for this purpose.



Emergency Room

A first contact emergency room has been established to facilitate patients visiting hospital during emergencies. E Room is equipped with ECG, Defibrillator, Cardiac Monitor, Pulse Oximeter and other emergency medicines to meet emergencies. Qualified nursing staff is also deployed.



Nursery and Children Ward

Obstetrics services are a major component of community hospital, provide 24/7 since 2007. The department is being run by a qualified Gynecologist/Obstetrician along with qualified/competent nursing staff. Neonatal Nursery is a component of such units. But unfortunately it was not available with the hospital and emergency cases have to be transferred to DHQ Hospital for treatment. Now we have established a separate Nursery with Incubators, Cardiac Monitors and other necessary equipment to deal with neonates born with complications, like respiratory problems, icterus- neonatorum and others. A qualified Child Specialist is monitoring the Nursery and Children ward.



Up Gradation of Diagnostic Services:

Laboratory Services:

By adding new diagnostic tools, lab services are improved and now almost 80 to 90 percent lab work is done locally. Further Lab services are provided 24/7 including holidays.

Radiology Services:

Radiology Services are being provided 24/7 including holidays. A digital system is installed and qualified/competent staff provides the services.



Future Plan

Paramedics are the first medical rapid responders to an emergency situation in fact, they are well trained to handle a situation that can be traumatic, their responsibility also is to transport the patient to the hospital in a safe and efficient manner.

According to the standards laid down by the Pakistan Nursing Council AJ&K is far behind the desired targets, that ultimately affect the quality of healthcare services at secondary and tertiary levels. According to standards the number of nurses required for existing beds in AJK is more than 2000, whereas presently only 647 nurses are available in different hospitals of AJK. Situation in rural areas is even worse.

Therefore, KIRF Management has decided to establish a paramedics training school at Jatlan District Mirpur Azad Kashmir.



The Major Objectives of The Project:

1. To contribute in overcoming shortage of nursing staff to improve the quality of healthcare services.
2. To follow the national policy of women empowerment by providing them more opportunities of education, employment and minimising gender imbalance.
3. To provide youngsters (Male and Female) an opportunity to support themselves and their families.
4. To contribute in national needs of health department.

II. EDUCATION

Education has a key role in the educational development of the child. Primary education prepares the child for higher classes and extended learning in later years. Primary education is the foremost and basic right of every child. In certain areas of Azad Jammu & Kashmir, facilities of even primary education does not exists. The management of KIRF believes that education in the panacea for all evils. Keeping this in view, KIRF has established primary schools only in those far-flung areas of the state where there was no school.

During the year, 2022-23, KIRF continued to operate the following five primary schools.

III. VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRES (VTCs)

Trained and technically equipped human resources are national assets and an essential requirement for sustainable national development. Women are presenting almost more than 50 percent of the population. They can be economically empowered through vocational and technical training. Kashmir International Relief Fund (KIRF) have arranged various training programmes through VTCs in different rural and far-flung areas of the state to provide training and skills to local Women.

Every year several Women complete their training from VTCs and they work at home or establish their businesses at local shopping centres for reasonable earning thus sharing the burden of expenses with their families.

IV. EMERGENCY RELIEF

Natural disasters such as floods, earthquake, tsunamis, or storms are catastrophic loss of human life, and affects infrastructure. Floods cause devastating effects on property, destruction of crops, loss of livestock and deterioration of health conditions owing to waterborne diseases. These disasters can also traumatise victims and their families for long period of time.

Similarly, the destructive effects of earthquakes cause landslides, tsunamis, fires and fault rupture. The violent shaking of the ground produces the greatest property and personal losses and injuries. In any of the above situation's victims are required immediate relief and afterwards rehabilitation.

The 2022 floods submerged one third of the country, affecting 33 million people, half of them were children. The floods damaged most of the water systems in affected areas, forcing mostly population to rely solely on contaminated water from ponds and Wells. Unsafe water and poor sanitation are key underlying causes of malnutrition.

Kashmir International Relief Fund (KIRF) immediately arranged a team of volunteers headed by Haji Shahid Iqbal Secretary Information KIRF with medical staff to travel to Rajanpur District. The team focused on the different villages of Union Council Janpur. Victims were provided medical treatment and meals for twelve days. Team has also arranged spray to kill mosquitos. The victims were provided mosquito nets and lotion to protect them from malaria .About 50 hand pumps were installed in different villages to provide clean drinking water and 50 families were provided a shelter of one constructed room to each family, with the financial support of donors.

Head of the team remained there for twenty-two days to facilitate the victims. During rehabilitation of flood affected people Secretary General KIRF Master Zulfiqar Ali also visited the affected area.





V. WATER SUPPLY SCHEMES



Safe and readily available Water is important for public health, whether it is used for drinking, domestic use, food production or recreational purposes. Improved water supply and sanitation, and better management of water resources, can boost countries' economic growth and can contribute greatly to poverty reduction.

Keeping in view its importance, KIRF has been creating awareness especially in the wealthy and highly Blessed members of the community to donate for making arrangements of clean water in those areas, where clean water is generally not available. The water schemes already established by KIRF in different areas at different times in Azad Kashmir have played a considerable role in resolving the issue of clean water. The water projects built by KIRF in such a way that not only human beings are being benefited but also very useful for the animals and irrigation purposes.

Pakistan's 2022 monsoon season produced significant rainfall, devastating floods. The floodwater contained sewage and other contamination caused serious health issues. KIRF management sent a team in effected areas of District Rajanpur, where the team arranged to install 50 hand pumps in different villages to provide clean drinking water to the flood victims.

Free Medical Camp

Knowing the risks can help to find ways to avoid health problems. It can also keep human from fretting over unlikely threats. Knowing the risks and benefits of a medical treatment can help public and doctors to make informed decisions.

For this purpose a free Medical Camp was organised by the management of KIRF on 2nd, June 2023. Risks and benefits of medical treatment were informed to the community members who visited the camp. Moreover participants had been examined by doctors and medicines were provided also free of cost.

Dr. Raja Sakindar Iqbal Medical and Public health specialist, Dr. Usman Shahid, Diabetologist and sugar specialist, and Dr. Adeel Zaman Choudhary Rheumatologist provided services to more than seventy patients in OPD.



Neonatal Resuscitation Workshop



A one day training workshop was arranged by Dr. Muhammad Irfan, Asst. Prof. Pediatrics, with the cooperation of NESTLY Pakistan on 11th March 2023 at community hospital jatlan. All Medical Officers, Gynecologist and nursing staff participated in the course. Participants told about common Neonatal problems and how to handle them. Various emergency procedures including CPR techniques were practiced on dummies. The course was very much appreciated by the participants.



Free Eye Camp



Free surgical eye camp was arranged by KIRF management in coordination with Eye Care Center at KIRF Community Hospital Jatlan on 20th May 2023 for Esal-e-Sawab of Haji Muhammad Malik (late) and Mrs. Mukhtar Begum (late).

Dr. Khawaja Abdul Hameed, Associate Professor MBBS MC Mirpur, assisted by Yasir Toufeeq and his team examined, advised and operated Eye cases during this two days camp.

The camp was inaugurated by KIRF management committee, Medical Director Community Hospital Jatlan Dr. Abdul Quddus Akhtar, Dr. Hameed Kh and his team, relatives of the donors and nursing staff of hospital.

During this two days activity, 593 patients were examined with different problems, 245 patients were advised for refractive errors and 50 cases were operated for cataracts with free IOL placement.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2023

1- **Status and Principal Activities**

Kashmir International Relief Fund was initially registered with Azad Jammu & Kashmir Council Secretariat Islamabad under the Azad Jammu & Kashmir Council Extension of Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (Registration and Control) Act, 1982 on **13th day of June, 2005**. After Azad Jammu and Kashmir Interim Constitution (13th amendment) Act 2018, by the Government of AJ&K, it has now been provisionally registered with Director Social welfare Directorate of Social Welfare, Muzafarabad AJ&K, under section 17 (1) of the AJ&K Charities Registration, Regulation & Facilitation Act, 2020 with the registration number **AJKCC/002/2023** with effect from **28th of March 2023**.

The registered office the fund is situated at **Kashmir International Relief Fund Hospital Jatlan, Mirpur Azad Kashmir (KIRF)**. The main activities of the fund is to provide basic health facilities and social welfare of general public.

2- **Statement of Compliance**

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting policies as adopted by Board of Governance.

3- **Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

3.1- **Basis of Preparation**

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

3.2- **Income and Expenditures Recognition**

a) Income from Donation / Aids and Charity, Hospital Income and Other Income are recognized on its receipt in cash.

b) All expenditures are recorded on accrual basis.

3.3- **Provision**

A provision is recognized in the Balance Sheet when the Kashmir International Relief Fund has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a past event, and it is probable than an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of obligation.

3.4- **Taxation**

Provision for taxation has not been made in these financial statements. The NPO has been applied for exemption under Clause (36) of Section 2 of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001.

3.5- Tangible Fixed Assets

All fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation is charged on reducing balance method on the rates stated in fixed assets schedule.

Full year depreciation charged on addition made during the year and no depreciation is charged in the year of disposal of the assets.

Maintenance and normal repairs are charged to expenses as and when incurred. Major renewals and improvement are capitalized. Gain or loss on disposal of fixed assets is included in current income, if any.

3.6- State of Financial Record

The Managing Committee who supervises the day to day affairs of NPO have assured us about the authenticity of the facts and figures taken in these financial statements, therefore, we have accepted the assurance as estimates/details provided appear to be genuine.

3.7- General

- i) Figures in these financial statements have been rounded off to the nearest rupee.
- ii) Prior year figures have been re-grouped / re-arranged wherever necessary for the purpose of comparison

KIRF has opened primary schools and vocational training centres in rural areas of different Districts to provide free education to children and skills to women, in respect of health a seventy bedded KIRF Community Hospital Jatlán where there poor and deserving families are being treated free of cost.

Keeping in view the requirements of renal failure patients the management of KIRF has established KIRF Kidney Dialysis Centre Jatlán with the financial support of Paktrust London, Waltham Forest Islamic Association London, Al-Flah Trust Pakistan and other philanthropists. Where free of charges kidney dialysis facility is being provided to kidney patients since 10th June 2021.

Now two separate wards have been established for the renal failure patients carrier of hepatitis B and C to secure the other patients from infections. The centre is providing dialysis facility to patients with qualified staff under the supervision of doctor. Due to increase in numbers of renal patients number of haemodialysis machines have been increased from 6 to 10 during this financial year with two shifts in a day. Now the centre is able to deliver 520 dialysis sessions per month. These facilities are not possible without financial support of benefactors and philanthropists. The management of KIRF is grateful to all of you and pray for acceptance of your donations and reward you in this world as well as in hereafter.

All projects of KIRF is to facilitate the poor and unprivileged segment of society and free of charges especially KIRF Kidney Dialysis Centre where the patient simply prefer for the quality of treatment and hygienically care.
